## The Performing Arts Center, Purchase College 2023-2024 Season Join us on our creative journey and "experience something real"

(Purchase, New York - June 28, 2023) THE PERFORMING ARTS CENTER, PURCHASE COLLEGE will present a full season of live, world-class performing arts starting in September of 2023. Tickets will go on sale Wednesday, July 12.

True to The Purchase PAC's mission to build an inclusive community, the upcoming season will feature a broad range of events that will include return visits by audience favorites, new work from Purchase alumni, introductions to innovative emerging artists, and ample opportunities for creative encounters and engagement.

The season will begin on Saturday, September 23 with a family-friendly performance by Step Afrika!, one of the most celebrated African American dance companies in the world. Step Afrika! is dedicated to preserving and promoting the tradition of stepping through performances that integrate songs, storytelling, humor and audience participation. The season will run through April of 2024; other highlights include a performance by Orpheus Chamber Orchestra with special guest Branford Marsalis, a dance series that includes Doug Varone and Dancers and A.I.M by Kyle Abraham – both led by Purchase Conservatory of Dance alums – and a Latin Jazz Festival headlined by piano great Eddie Palmieri.

Tickets will be available for sale online 24/7 starting July 12, and by phone during box office hours, from 10am to 12pm on Mondays and Wednesdays. Box office hours will be extended after August 30.

The Klezmatics Sunday, November 12, 2023, 3pm \$45

The Klezmatics are globally-renowned world music superstars — and the only klezmer band ever to win a Grammy award. They emerged out of the vibrant cultural scene of New York City's East Village in 1986 playing klezmer steeped in Eastern European Jewish tradition and spirituality, while incorporating contemporary themes such as human rights and anti-fundamentalism, and eclectic musical influences including Arab, African, Latin and Balkan rhythms, jazz and punk. In the course of over twenty years and nine albums they have stubbornly continued making music that is wild, mystical, provocative, reflective, and ecstatically danceable.

Get a look at the stars of tomorrow during this day-long Latin Jazz Festival and competition, featuring eight high school bands facing off in front of a panel of judges made up of local music industry leaders.

Eddie Palmieri and the Purchase Latin Jazz Orchestra Saturday, February 10, 2024, 8pm \$55 / \$40 / \$25

A dazzling pianist whose technique incorporates bits and pieces of everyone from McCoy Tyner to Herbie Hancock and recycles them through a dynamic Latin groove, Eddie Palmieri (aka "El Maestro") has been a Latin jazz and salsa master since the mid-'50s.

His approach can be compared to Thelonious Monk's for its unorthodox patterns, odd rhythms, sometimes disjointed phrases, and percussive effects played in a manner that is always successfully resolved. It's a free/hard bop/Afro-Caribbean blend, with keyboard solos and montunos that are forever stimulating.

Palmieri has released dozens of records on various labels. He is the recipient of nine Grammy and three Latin Grammy Awards, the National Endowment for the Arts' distinguished Jazz Master Award and the Latin Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences' Lifetime Achievement Award.

Palmieri will be joined by the Purchase Latin Jazz Orchestra. This performance is presented in partnership with Purchase College Conservatory of Music, as part of the Purchase College High School Latin Jazz Festival.

Urban Bush Women: Legacy + Lineage + Liberation Saturday, February 24, 2024, 8pm \$55 / \$40 / \$25

Urban Bush Women's *Legacy + Lineage + Liberation* celebrates the power of Women(+) in an evening of classic works by UBW Founder / Visioning Partner Jawole Willa Jo Zollar. These iconic works transcend genres and amplify the voices of women of color, resonate in this time of reflection around equity and justice, and lift up Black lives in inspiring ways. Experience UBW's great sense of musicality, reflection inside of empathy and joy — a gracious invitation to respond to what you are experiencing and to leave the theater energized and inspired.

Founded in 1984 by choreographer Jawole Willa Jo Zollar, <u>Urban Bush Women</u> (UBW) electrifies audiences with performances that blend dance, instrumental music, and theater to express black, woman-centered perspectives and catalyze social change. Through innovative choreography, community collaboration, and artistic leadership development, UBW brings untold and under-told stories to light while highlighting the beauty and strength of the African Diaspora.

Doug Varone and Dancers: *To My Arms / Restore* (world premiere) Saturday, March 16, 2024, 8pm \$70 / \$45/ \$30

Experience the world premiere of *To My Arms / Restore*, an evening-long two-part work that embodies dancemaker Doug Varone's choreographic fascination with the interplay of the deeply emotional and the immensely physical.

Set to a suite of exquisite operatic arias by Georg Fredric Handel, *To My Arms* (Part 1) builds a rich and distinct landscape of love and loss within a suite of ten dances, evoking a strange otherworld of intimacy. In stark contrast, *Restore* (Part 2) is visceral and tactile, driven by the 21th century sound of DJ Nico Bentley's *Handel Remix*, a score that fuses the fundamentals of Handel's 18th century choral score *Dixit Dominus* with beats more commonly heard in clubs around the globe; the result is a marriage between a score and a dance that is unabashedly glorious.

For more than 30 years, <u>Doug Varone and Dancers</u> has devoted itself to the humanity and virtuosity of dance, reaching out to audiences well beyond the proscenium arch, earning a reputation as one of the most respected dance companies working today. Varone received his BFA from Purchase College where he was awarded the President's Distinguished Alumni Award in 2007.

Contemporary dance company A.I.M by Kyle Abraham is celebrated as one of the most consistently excellent troupes working today by *The New York Times*, and we most certainly agree. Led by MacArthur Genius and Purchase College alum Kyle Abraham, A.I.M returns to The Purchase PAC with a repertory program that showcases his brilliance as an Artistic Director who is constantly innovating the industry. He will serve us his signature "postmodern gumbo"- a blend of modern dance styles ranging from ballet to hip hop, seasoned with human stories and social commentary.

The mission of <u>A.I.M by Kyle Abraham</u> is to create a body of dance-based work that is galvanized by Black culture and history. While grounded in choreographer Kyle Abraham's artistic vision, A.I.M draws inspiration from a multitude of sources and movement styles. Abraham received his BFA from Purchase College.
